#### **Funding Process:**

- CAA has broken out the funding process timeline by Service Provider Type to help identify key action items that need to be completed before launch on July 1 as part of the RMA implementation
- Service Provider types include:
  - Local Governments (LGs) or their Designated Service Providers (DSPs)
  - Reload/Transfer Stations
  - Commingled Recycling Processing Facilities (CRPFs)

 Includes requirements for ensuring access to the Service Provider portal as well as timelines for training and data entry

#### **Education & Outreach Material Availability**

Includes timeline for materials and portal availability

\* If you are a Local Government that has designated a Service Provider, the responsibility for all designated tasks is that of the Service Provider.

# Funding Process Timeline for Local Governments and their Designated Service Providers (DSPs)\*

#### Most Relevant Addendum for Local Governments by June 2 to Avoid Interruptions:

- USCL Depot Expansion Addendum: Covers costs associated with adding additional materials to a depot for enhancing and/or managing a USCL depot point to comply with OTR or RMA requirements.
- **Transportation:** LGs must determine where USCL materials are sent after pickup, and which party needs to receive this funding stream by June 2. Typically, local transfer station or reload facilities that incur transportation costs would receive the funds. Transportation reimbursement only applies to locations that need to send the material more than 50 miles to a certified CRPF or REM. Proof of execution will fall to the local government and not the Service Provider or Reload facility if LGs do not grant full transportation authorization.
- **Glass:** \$77 per ton to support established depot or collection programs to be signed by LGs wishing to receive the funding directly for continued glass collection.
  - If the LG would like to authorize that funding to go to the service provider or providers, please email <u>Oregonfunding@circularaction.org</u> and provide the name and contact information of the service provider(s) that should receive the incentive.
  - If your community is currently using recycling glass for alternative daily cover (ADC), please reach out to CAA at Oregoninfo@circularaction.org

#### Other Addenda of Interest for Local Governments:

- **Contamination Reduction:** \$3 per capita funding for contamination reduction. LGs may make their funding request after they have signed a PFA and once an approved list of reimbursable requests are established by DEQ.
- System Expansion Funding: Covers eligible funding an LG or its SP may need to build the infrastructure to collect USCL materials
- Roll Cart Addendum: Covers the cost of purchasing roll carts with 10% PCR when a price delta exists. Currently, no delta exists, but CAA will review this quarterly.

Most Relevant Addendum for Reload/Transfer by June 2 to avoid interruptions:

- USCL Depot Expansion Addendum: Covers costs associated with adding additional materials to a depot for enhancing and/or managing a USCL Collection at Depot point to comply with OTR or RMA requirements.
- **Transportation:** Locations that consolidate USCL materials and want to receive this funding stream starting July 1st, 2025 should contact your LG and confirm that they have authorized your location to receive funding. Typically, reload and transfer facilities would be authorized to perform this service and receive the funding. Transportation reimbursement only applies to locations that need to send the material more than 50 miles to a certified CRPF or REM.

#### Other Addendums of interest for Reload/Transfer

**System Expansion Funding:** Covers eligible funding a LG or it's authorized SP may need in order to build the infrastructure to collect USCI materials

Most Relevant Addendum for CRPFs by July 1 to avoid interruptions: You will be notified when this addendum is available.

- **PCRF:** Processor Commodity Risk Fee is required for eligible CRPF Facilities
- **CMF:** Contamination Management Fees are required for eligible CRPF Facilities
- These fees compensate CRPF facilities for receiving and sorting covered materials, disposing of contaminants and residue, managing material cost fluctuations and implementing facility improvements required to meet CRPF RMA requirements.

It is critical that all organizations that wish to receive funding from CAA sign a PFA agreement no later than June 2 in order to ensure access to our SP Portal and training materials
